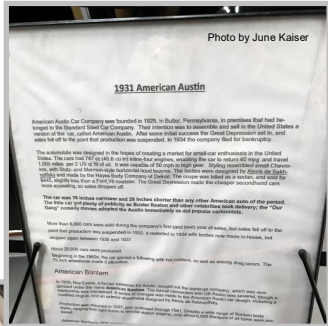

TECH TIPS FROM PETE YUEN AND PAST EVENT

Deja View . . . Revisiting A Page From The Past . . . “THAT’S WHAT I HEARD”

The grand essentials in life are something to do, someone to love and something to hope for. On low pressure tires as used on our cars today which uses 24-36 psi, it is considered dangerous to inflate the tire in excess of 40 psi. The excess pressure may cause the bead or even the rim to break. If the tubeless tire does not seat by using 35 psi, then deflate the tire, reposition on the rim, re-lubricate (but not with oil) and re-inflate.

When a person buys a car through a private sale, he is subject to the possibility that the car has a lien on it. An established and reputable dealer (if you can find one) is bonded. It is still possible to buy a car with a lien on it from a dealer, but the purchaser is not obligated to satisfy the lien in British Columbia, Canada.

In 1899, James Ward Packard built his first car. This was because he had bought a Winton in the preceding year. The new Winton had many shortcomings which Mr. Packard pointed out to Alexander Winton. 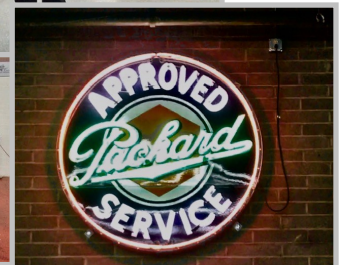
